# PRESIDENT'S LETTER: CHARTING THE COURSE FOR 2024

It is early in 2024, and the AAPP Foundation Board has already been hard at work! In January, we welcomed two new members of the AAPP Foundation Board of Directors, Drs. Clayton English and Phillip Lai. We look forward to their leadership on the Board!



The Board has been working on several initiatives for this year. Once again, your generous support of the Foundation has allowed the board to support several wonderful initiatives that will allow us to continue our mission, which is to advance the psychiatric pharmacy profession by supporting research, scholarship, and practitioner development. The Foundation Board of Directors has awarded a total of \$4,465 to 19 PharmD students from 16 colleges of pharmacy registration grants to attend the AAPP 2024 Annual Meeting in Orlando, Florida. Applicants were required to submit a personal essay expressing their interest in AAPP and psychiatric pharmacy. The Board also continues to support the Strategic Goals Award (\$500). Two finalists were selected, and the winner will be announced at the annual meeting following the judging of platform presentations. The Foundation will continue to support Collegiate Chapter Impact Grants and Defining the Future Grants in 2024 along with four virtual Mental Health First Aid courses.

The AAPP Foundation's theme for this year's Annual Meeting is "wellbeing" and will feature some special events. First, the Foundation is sponsoring a Creativity Room! Take a "brain break" and have some fun making friendship bracelets and keychains throughout the week. Attendees who make a \$25+ donation to the AAPP Foundation during the AAPP Annual Meeting will get an exclusive set of mental health beads and charms to use in their bracelets and keychains. Next, the AAPP Foundation is sponsoring a ¼ mile unity walk on Wednesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, and we hope you will join us. Plan to wear your favorite mental health-themed t-shirt and make a sign to carry in the Creativity Room. Grab your friends and take a photo at the AAPP Foundation-sponsored photo booth! Finally, the Foundation is sponsoring a session, *Living Through Loss - Navigating Loss by Suicide as a Clinician-Survivor*, in memory of Kim Tallian who passed away in January 2023, utilizing part of her estate bequest. We hope you will join us and prioritize your wellbeing in Orlando, April 7-10.



Lastly for 2024, AAPP has committed up to \$500,000 to the AAPP Foundation to establish the AAPP Outcomes Initiative Grant, which will fund up to 2 projects at \$250,000 maximum each. The pre-application process is complete, and announcements will be made soon!

### MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID TO BE OFFERED JUNE 4 AND 6: REGISTER TODAY!

The AAPP Foundation is proud to once again sponsor Mental Health First Aid! Two courses will be offered, June 4 and 6, and up to 60 individuals may participate. The blended course involves 2 hours of home-study coursework and 6 hours of virtual instruction with a certified instructor in a Zoom classroom.



#### Participants will Learn:

- Risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems.
- Information on depression, anxiety, trauma, psychosis, and addiction disorders.
- A 5-step action plan to help someone developing a mental health problem or in crisis.
- Where to turn for help professional, peer, and self-help resources.

## Learn more and save your seat today!

Mental Health First Aid is a nationally-offered course that teaches participants how to identify, understand, and respond to signs of mental illnesses and substance use disorders. The United States is just one of the many countries that have adopted the program. According to MentalHealthFirstAid.org, nearly 3.8 million people across the United States have been trained in Mental Health First Aid by over 15,000 instructors.

Following the training, participants will receive a certificate from Mental Health First Aid USA acknowledging certification which is valid for 3 years.

## KIM TALLIAN BEQUEST PROVIDES SUPPORT TO AAPP 2024

The estate bequest made by long-time AAPP member Kim Tallian, PharmD, BCPP, FASHP, FCCP, FCSHP, APH will be partially applied to a session sponsorship at the upcoming 2024 AAPP Annual Meeting titled, <u>Living Through Loss - Navigating Loss by Suicide as a Clinician-Survivor</u>, presented by Dr. Julie Cerel. Dr. Tallian was a passionate psychiatric pharmacist and advocate for the profession, students, residents and patients, Dr. Tallian passed away in January 2023 after a 3-year battle with cancer.

Kim was an Advanced Practice Specialist in Psychiatry at Scripps Mercy Hospital (SMH) and PGY-2 Psychiatric Pharmacy Residency Program Director. Prior to SMH, she was a psychiatric pharmacist at UC San Diego Health and also served on the UC San Diego Pharmacy Team as a leader of medication safety. Dr. Tallian was committed to AAPP as a long-time, consistent member. She was a speaker for AAPP as well as a long-time author of the Neurologic Disorders chapter of the Psychiatric Pharmacotherapy Review Course. She served as a member of the Government Affairs Committee and as co-author of an AAPP supported journal article (pending publication) entitled *Social Determinants of Health in People Living with Psychiatric Disorders: The Role of Pharmacists*. Dr. Tallian was also a friend of the AAPP Foundation supporting initiatives as a Neuron level donor.
